

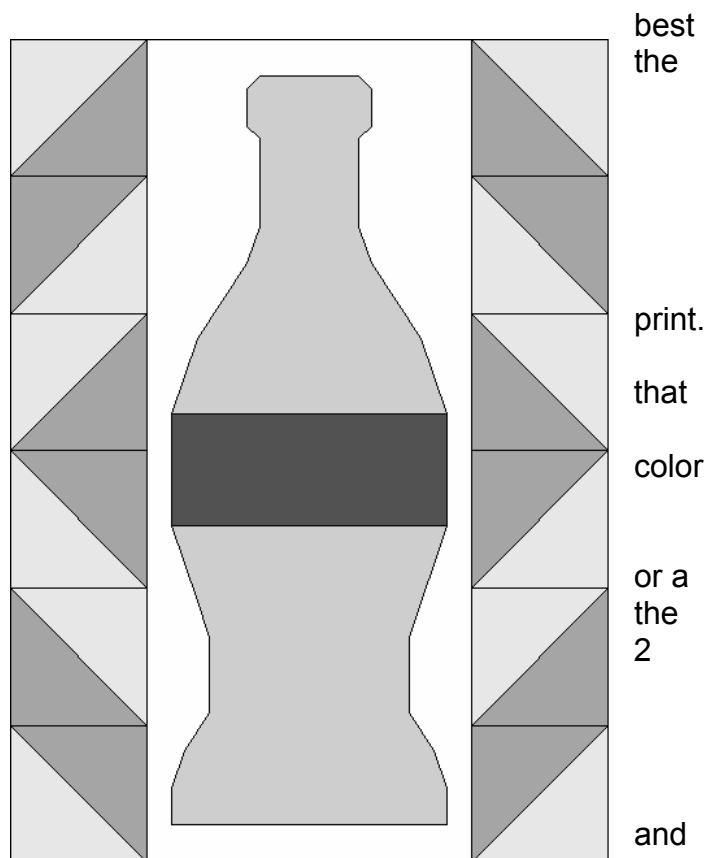
Coca-Cola Fabric Lap Size Quilt Top Pattern

Choosing your fabrics

When choosing colors, prints will work the best and make for a more interesting pattern. Look at picture to the side. The “bottle design” in the middle requires several different fabrics. This pattern was designed to resemble a Coca-cola bottle, therefore the colors have been chosen accordingly. If you are going to use a fabric with Coca-cola print on it, then choose that first. The other fabrics can then be matched to that main print. You will need 3 different red fabrics for the background behind the bottle, a dark brown fabric resembles the color of cola, a tan caramel colored fabric, a medium green fabric that resembles the of a green glass cola bottle, another green that is lighter than the previous one, a white or off-white fabric, and gray fabric. You need Coca-cola fabric different fabric to be used in the middle section of bottle where a label would normally be. You need different fabrics to be used in the outer side portions of the quilt, and you also need a border fabric. These three fabrics can be fabrics that are already included in the quilt or they can be different fabrics. Listed below are fabric quantities supplies needed.



- 3 different red fabrics: 1/2 yd. of 2 of them, 2/3 yd. of 1 of them
- Gray fabric: 1/8 yd.
- White or off-white fabric: 1/4 yd.
- Light green fabric: 1/3 yd.
- Medium green fabric: 3/8 yd.
- Dark brown fabric: 7/8 yd.
- Tan fabric: 1/2 yd.
- Coca-cola fabric or other fabric for the label: 1/2 yd.
- 2 different fabrics for the outer side portions: 1 yd. each
- Fabric for your border: 1 1/4 yd.
- Coordinating color thread, Pins, Iron and an ironing board
- Use a ruler and a rotary cutter **-OR-** a ruler to draw straight lines with a pencil, then scissors to cut with to ensure straight and even cuts.
- Finishing supplies (backing, batting, and binding)

Cutting the Pieces

- Cut all strips selvage to selvage.
- Get a blank piece of paper so you can staple a small piece of each fabric to it and mark a letter label next to it. Label the 3 different reds A, B, and C. It does not matter which red gets which letter except for the red that you have a larger cut of gets labeled C. Label the gray fabric D, the white fabric E, the light green fabric F, the medium green fabric G, the dark brown fabric H, the tan fabric I, the Coca-cola fabric J, the 2 fabrics for the outer side portions K and L, and the

border fabric M. While sewing and following the directions you can refer back to these pieces to help you remember what the different fabrics are labeled.

- Red fabric A and B (cut these same pieces for both fabrics):
 - Cut 4 strips 2 ½" wide. Set 3 of the 4 strips aside. With the remaining strip, cut the length of the strip into 3 ½" pieces, so you have rectangles that are 2 ½" x 3 ½".
 - Cut 2 strips 1 ½" wide. Cut the length of one of these strips into 1 ½" pieces so you have squares that are 1 ½" x 1 ½". Cut the length of the other strip into 3 ½" pieces so you have rectangles that are 1 ½" x 3 ½".
- Red fabric C:
 - Cut 5 strips 2 ½" wide. Set 3 of the 5 strips aside. Cut the length of the 2 remaining strips into 3 ½" pieces, so you have rectangles that are 2 ½" x 3 ½".
 - Cut 3 strips 1 ½" wide. Cut the length of one of these strips into 1 ½" pieces so you have squares that are 1 ½" x 1 ½". Cut the length of the other 2 strips into 3 ½" pieces so you have rectangles that are 1 ½" x 3 ½".
 - Cut 1 strip 2 ½" wide. Cut the length of this strip into 2 ½" pieces so you have squares that are 2 ½" x 2 ½".
- Gray fabric D:
 - Cut 1 strip 1 ½" wide. Cut the length of this strip into 2 ½" pieces so you have rectangles that are 1 ½" x 2 ½".
- White fabric E:
 - Cut 1 strip 2 ½" wide. Cut 2 pieces 2 ½" wide off of the length of this strip so you have 2 squares that are 2 ½" x 2 ½". Cut the rest of this strip into 1 ½" pieces so you have rectangles that are 1 ½" x 2 ½".
 - Cut 1 strip 2" wide. Cut a piece 10 ½" off of the length of this strip so you have a rectangle that is 2" x 10 ½".
- Light green fabric F:
 - Cut 2 strips 1 ½" wide. Cut the length of one of these strips into 3 ½" pieces so you have rectangles that are 1 ½" x 3 ½". Cut 2 pieces 1 ½" wide off of the length of the other strip so you have 2 squares that are 1 ½" x 1 ½". Cut 4 pieces 2 ½" wide off of the length of this strip so you have 4 rectangles that are 1 ½" x 2 ½". Cut 1 piece 10 ½" wide off of the length of this strip so you have a rectangle that is 1 ½" x 10 ½".
 - Cut 1 strip 2 ½" wide. Cut 2 pieces 2 ½" wide off of the length of this strip so you have 2 squares that are 2 ½" x 2 ½". Cut 1 piece 9 ½" wide off of the length of this strip so you have a rectangle that is 2 ½" x 9 ½".
 - Cut 1 strip 1" wide. Cut 1 piece 5 ½" wide off of the length of this strip so you have a rectangle that is 1" x 5 ½". Cut 1 piece 8 ½" wide off of the length of this strip so you have a rectangle that is 1" x 8 ½". Cut 1 piece 10 ½" wide off of the length of this strip so you have a rectangle that is 1" x 10 ½".
- Medium green fabric G:
 - Cut 2 strips 1 ½" wide. Cut the length of one of these strips into 3 ½" pieces so you have rectangles that are 1 ½" x 3 ½". Cut 2 pieces 3 ½" wide off of the length of the other strip so you have 2 rectangles that are 1 ½" x 3 ½". Cut 6 pieces 2 ½" wide off of the length of this strip so you have 6 rectangles that are 1 ½" x 2 ½". Cut 2 pieces 1 ½" wide off of the length of this strip so you have 2 squares that are 1 ½" x 1 ½".
 - Cut 1 strip 2 ½" wide. Cut the length of this strip into 2 ½" pieces so you have squares that are 2 ½" x 2 ½".

- Cut 1 strip 1" wide. Cut 1 piece $2\frac{1}{2}$ " wide off of the length of this strip so you have a rectangle that is 1" x $2\frac{1}{2}$ ". Cut 1 piece $5\frac{1}{2}$ " wide off of the length of this strip so you have a rectangle that is 1" x $5\frac{1}{2}$ ". Cut 1 piece $10\frac{1}{2}$ " wide off of the length of this strip so you have a rectangle that is 1" x $10\frac{1}{2}$ ".
- Cut 1 strip 3" wide. Cut 1 piece $10\frac{1}{2}$ " off of the length of this strip so you have a rectangle that is 3" x $10\frac{1}{2}$ ".
- Dark brown fabric H:
 - Cut 10 strips $1\frac{1}{2}$ " wide. Cut the length of 8 of these strips into $3\frac{1}{2}$ " pieces so you have rectangles that are $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ ". Cut the length of 1 of these strips into $2\frac{1}{2}$ " pieces so you have rectangles that are $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $2\frac{1}{2}$ ". Cut 2 pieces $1\frac{1}{2}$ " wide off of the length of the remaining strip so you have 2 squares that are $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $1\frac{1}{2}$ ". Cut 1 piece $16\frac{1}{2}$ " wide off of the length of this strip so you have 1 rectangle that is $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $16\frac{1}{2}$ ". Cut 1 piece $22\frac{1}{2}$ " wide off of the length of this strip so you have 1 rectangle that is $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $22\frac{1}{2}$ ".
 - Cut 4 strips $2\frac{1}{2}$ " wide. Cut the length of 3 of these strips into $3\frac{1}{2}$ " pieces so you have rectangles that are $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ ". Cut the length of the remaining strip into $2\frac{1}{2}$ " pieces so you have squares that are $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $2\frac{1}{2}$ ".
- Tan fabric I:
 - Cut 5 strips $1\frac{1}{2}$ " wide. Cut the length of 4 of these strips into $3\frac{1}{2}$ " pieces so you have rectangles that are $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ ". Cut 2 pieces $1\frac{1}{2}$ " wide off of the length of the remaining strip so you have 2 squares that are $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $1\frac{1}{2}$ ". Cut the rest of the strip into $2\frac{1}{2}$ " pieces so you have rectangles that are $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $2\frac{1}{2}$ ".
 - Cut 1 strip $2\frac{1}{2}$ " wide. Cut the length of this strip into $3\frac{1}{2}$ " pieces so you have rectangles that are $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ ".
- Coca-cola fabric J:
 - Cut 1 strip $9\frac{1}{2}$ " wide. Cut 1 piece $22\frac{1}{2}$ " off of the length of this strip so you have a rectangle that is $9\frac{1}{2}$ " x $22\frac{1}{2}$ ".
- Fabric K and L (cut these same pieces for both fabrics):
 - Cut 2 strips 12" wide. Cut the length of all of these strips into 12" pieces so you have 6 squares that are 12" x 12". Cut all 6 of these 12" x 12" squares diagonally from corner to corner so you have 12 triangles.
- Border fabric M:
 - Cut 7 strips $5\frac{1}{4}$ " wide. Cut 1 of the strips in half.

Coca-Cola Fabric Lap Size Quilt Top Kit

Instructions

Finished size of the quilt top will be approximately 74" x 59"

Sewing and seam allowances

This kit contains a large number of small pieces. In order for this quilt top to come together correctly, it is very important to follow the instructions very carefully. Sew an accurate and consistent $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance throughout the quilt. To make this easier, use a presser foot with a $\frac{1}{4}$ " edge so you can line up the edges of the fabric with the side of the presser foot. You may also use a magnetic seam guide placed on the metal plate under the presser foot to help guide the fabric. When sewing use a small stitch, at least 14 to 15 stitches per inch. This way you do not need to backstitch.

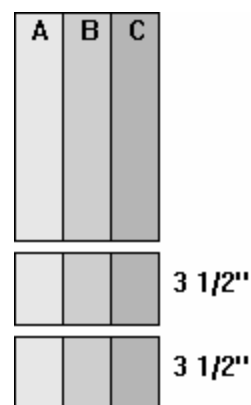
Pressing

Strips and pieces are sewn right sides together. Before opening, lay the strips flat and lightly press to set the seam. Then open and press seam allowances to one side. Make sure there are no folds at the seam line. Turn over and press the reverse side and check that the seam allowances are pressed in the right direction.

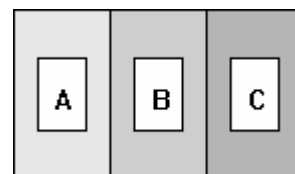
Getting Started

1. The fabrics labeled A through I, some have strips, and most of them have a wide variety of small pieces. When beginning to sew, leave the sticker letter labels on at least one piece of the fabric it goes to. Later you will be moving them.

2. Start with one each of the long red strips labeled A, B, and C. Sew strip A to strip B right sides together along one of the long sides. Press seam allowance toward strip A. Sew strip C to the long open edge of strip B, right sides together. Press seam allowance toward strip B. When done, this should look similar to the figure to the left. All seam allowances should be pressed in the same direction. Cut the length of this finished piece into $3\frac{1}{2}$ " pieces. Use a ruler and marking pen or a rotary cutter to ensure straight and even cuts. Stack and set these pieces aside.

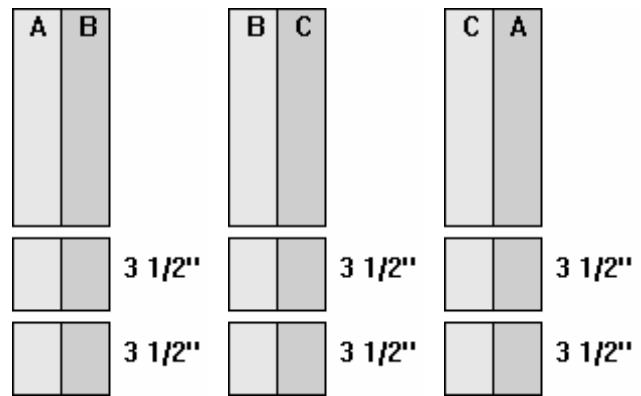


3. Take one of the red ABC $3\frac{1}{2}$ " pieces. Take the sticker letter labels off of the red fabrics and stick them on the coordinating fabrics on this ABC piece, as pictured below. You may not need this piece to complete the quilt top. Set this piece aside and use it while sewing and following the directions so you can refer back to these pieces to help you remember what the different fabrics are labeled.



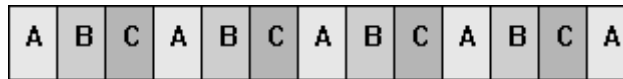
4. Take a sheet of paper and stick the letter labels D through I on it. Write next to the letters which fabric that letter was on (i.e. D=gray, E=white, F=light green, G=dark green, H=dark brown, I=tan). While sewing and following the directions you can refer back to this sheet to help you remember which letter goes to which fabric.

5. Take one each of the red strips labeled A and B. Sew strip A to strip B right sides together along one of the long sides. Press seam allowance toward fabric A. Cut the length of this finished piece into 3 1/2" pieces. Stack and set these pieces aside. Repeat with one each of the red strips labeled B and C, pressing seam allowance toward fabric B. Cut, stack, and set aside. Repeat with one each of the red strips labeled C and A, pressing seam allowance toward fabric C. Cut, stack, and set aside.

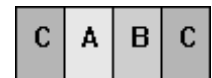


Assembling The Rows

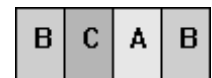
6. Sew 4 of the red ABC pieces along the short edges, right sides together, connecting the end of one piece (fabric C) to the beginning of the next piece (fabric A). You should have one long row 12 pieces long. The edge with fabric A will be referred to as the beginning of the row. The edge with fabric C will be referred to as the end of the row. Press seam allowances in the same direction of the ones that are already pressed. Sew one of the small 2.5" x 3.5" pieces of red fabric A to the END of the row, right sides together. Press seam allowance in the same direction. Your finished row should be 13 pieces long, and look similar to the figure below. To keep track of which row this is, pin a small piece of paper labeled #1 to this row. You should put the label on the beginning of the row so you can also keep track of which direction the row will go when putting them together. Repeat this procedure and label this one row #20.



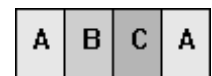
7. Sew one of the CA pieces to one of the BC pieces along the short edges, right sides together, connecting the pieces as shown. Press seam allowance in the same direction of the ones that are already pressed. Repeat this procedure 3 more times and label 2 of them row #2 and label the other 2 row #5.



8. Sew one of the BC pieces to one of the AB pieces along the short edges, right sides together, connecting the pieces as shown. Press seam allowance in the same direction. Repeat this procedure 3 more times and label 2 of them row #3 and the other 2 row #6.



9. Sew one of the AB pieces to one of the CA pieces along the short edges, right sides together, connecting the pieces as shown. Press seam allowance in the same direction. Repeat only one more time and label both of them row #4.



10. Lay out one set of the rows 2 through 6 by number on a large table or the floor, right sides up. Fold row #2 down over row #3, right sides together, matching edges. Sew along the long top edge, and press seam allowance toward row #2. Fold row #4 down over row #5, right sides together, matching edges. Sew along the long top edge, and press seam allowance toward row #4. Lay out the rows by number again. Fold the row 2 & 3 piece over the 4 & 5 piece, right sides together, matching edges. Sew along the long top edge. Press seam allowance the same direction as the others. Lay out the rows by number again. Fold the 2, 3, 4, 5 piece over the #6 piece, right sides together, matching edges. Sew along the long top edge. Press seam allowance. Repeat with the other set of numbered rows 2 through 6 and sew them together in the same manner so you have 2 of these pieces pictured. Set these 2 pieces aside for now, but keep the row labels on them.

11. Lines need to be made on the back of certain pieces. To do this, use a ruler and a pencil and mark a light line from one corner to the other. Be sure to do this on the wrong side of the fabric. On some of the pieces the line has to be drawn a certain way. Look at Figure 1 and Figure 2. The tables below tell you which sizes and pieces need the lines on them. It also tells you which way the line needs to go (Figure 1 or Figure 2). This is the way the line needs to go on the wrong side of the fabric. The third table does not specify Figure 1 or Figure 2. This is because the third table is all squares, so it doesn't matter which way the line goes as long as it is from one corner diagonally to the other. Pay very careful attention to the sizes of the pieces. After done, separate all these pieces into 2 piles, Figure 1 pile and Figure 2 pile. Label these piles.

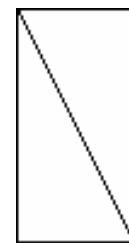

- 12.** Take the 2 pieces of $1\frac{1}{2}'' \times 2\frac{1}{2}''$ E pieces (1 from pile 1 and 1 from pile 2), and also 2 pieces of D fabric (same size) without lines. Lay the D pieces face up on the table. Now lay the E pieces face down on top of the D pieces, positioning the pencil marks as shown below and matching opposite corners. The pieces should be right sides together. Pin the 2 pieces together so they do not slip while sewing, and then sew along the pencil mark.

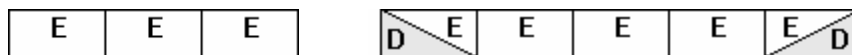


- 13.** Trim approximately $\frac{1}{4}''$ away from the seam line cutting through both layers. Open the piece and press. This will give you a rectangle with 2 different fabrics in it.

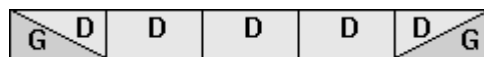


- 14.** This kit has several of these 2 fabric rectangles in it. The tables on the next page tell you which 2 fabrics need to be joined together to make a rectangle, and how many of these rectangles are needed. One of the pieces needs to have a line on it, so the table also tells you which pile to take the piece out of (Figure 1 pile or Figure 2 pile). The other piece does not need a line on it, so do not take it from one of the piles. Pay very careful attention to the sizes of the pieces. Always match opposite corners as shown above, and always lay the pieces right sides together. Press the finished pieces open. After sewing all of the pieces listed on the tables, go on to the next step.

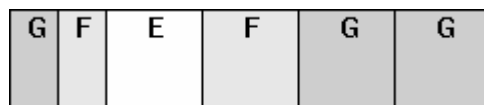
- 15.** Sew 3 of the $1\frac{1}{2}'' \times 2\frac{1}{2}''$ fabric E pieces, right sides together, to make one long piece as shown. Now sew a rectangle with fabrics D and E $1\frac{1}{2}'' \times 2\frac{1}{2}''$ to each side of the piece as shown. Press.



- 16.** Sew 3 of the $1\frac{1}{2}'' \times 2\frac{1}{2}''$ fabric D pieces, right sides together. Now sew a rectangle with fabrics D and G $1\frac{1}{2}'' \times 2\frac{1}{2}''$ to each side of the piece as shown. Press.



- 17.** Sew these pieces right sides together from left to right. G- $1\frac{1}{2}'' \times 2\frac{1}{2}''$, F- $1\frac{1}{2}'' \times 2\frac{1}{2}''$, E- $2\frac{1}{2}'' \times 2\frac{1}{2}''$, F- $2\frac{1}{2}'' \times 2\frac{1}{2}''$, G- $2\frac{1}{2}'' \times 2\frac{1}{2}''$, G- $2\frac{1}{2}'' \times 2\frac{1}{2}''$. Press.



- 18.** Sew these pieces right sides together from left to right. F- $1'' \times 5\frac{1}{2}''$, G- $1'' \times 5\frac{1}{2}''$. Press.



- 19.** Sew these pieces right sides together from left to right. F- $1'' \times 8\frac{1}{2}''$, G- $1'' \times 2\frac{1}{2}''$. Press.

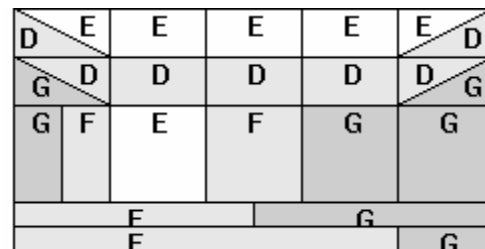

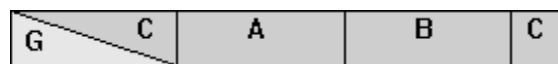
20. Take the 5 rows you just made and sew them together as shown from top to bottom. Lay this piece face up on the table. Press.



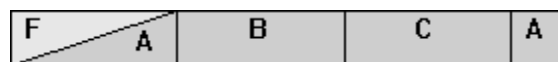
21. Take 4 (2 A, 1 B, and 1 C) of the 1 1/2" x 1 1/2" squares which have lines on the back of them. Place them face down as shown, matching them to the corners and positioning the lines as shown. Pin these pieces down. Sew along the pencil lines. Trim the corners approximately 1/4" away from the seam line, cutting through both layers. Fold open and press corners.



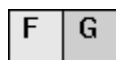
22. Sew these pieces right sides together from left to right. G/C-1 1/2" x 3 1/2" from figure 1 pile, A-1 1/2" x 3 1/2", B-1 1/2" x 3 1/2", C-1 1/2" x 1 1/2", Press.



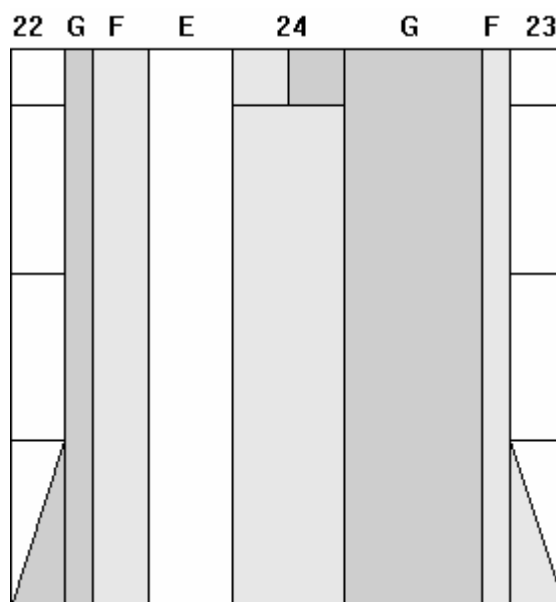
23. Sew these pieces right sides together from left to right. F/A-1 1/2" x 3 1/2" from figure 2 pile, B-1 1/2" x 3 1/2", C-1 1/2" x 3 1/2", A-1 1/2" x 1 1/2", Press.



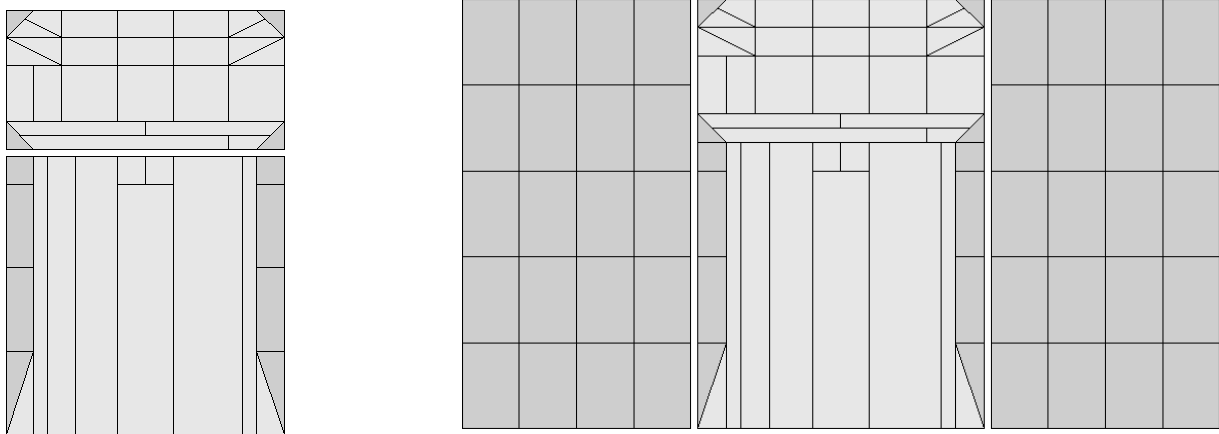
24. Sew together these 2 pieces right sides together. F-1 1/2" x 1 1/2" and G-1 1/2" x 1 1/2". Now sew this piece to the end of the long fabric F piece 2 1/2" x 9 1/2" as shown. Press.



25. Sew these 3 pieces from the previous 3 steps together with the following pieces from left to right. Piece from step 22, G-1" x 10 1/2", F-1 1/2" x 10 1/2", E-2" x 10 1/2", piece from step 24, G-3" x 10 1/2", F-1" x 10 1/2", piece from step 23. Press.



- 26.** Sew the 2 large piece right sides together as shown. Press. Now sew this piece, as shown, to the 2 large red pieces from before, keeping row 2 at the top and row 6 at the bottom. Press. Still keep the label on this piece as was on the red pieces (rows #2, #3, #4, #5, and #6).



- 27.** The next steps assemble the rows one by one. The pieces are all listed from left to right, right side up. Lay out the listed pieces, right side up, and compare it carefully to the picture before sewing.
- 28.** Sew these pieces right sides together from left to right. ABC piece, A/H-2 1/2" x 3 1/2" from figure 1 pile, H-2 1/2" x 3 1/2", F-1 1/2" x 3 1/2", H-1 1/2" x 3 1/2", C-2 1/2" x 3 1/2", H-1 1/2" x 3 1/2", G-1 1/2" x 3 1/2", H-2 1/2" x 3 1/2", A/H-2 1/2" x 3 1/2" from figure 2 pile, B-2 1/2" x 3 1/2", CA piece. Press. Label this piece row #7.



- 29.** Sew these pieces right sides together from left to right. CA piece, B/H-2 1/2" x 3 1/2" from figure 1 pile, H-1 1/2" x 3 1/2", I/H-1 1/2" x 3 1/2" from figure 1 pile, I/H-1 1/2" x 3 1/2" from figure 1 pile, F/H-1 1/2" x 3 1/2" from figure 1 pile, F/H-1 1/2" x 3 1/2" from figure 1 pile, H-1 1/2" x 3 1/2", H-2 1/2" x 3 1/2", H-1 1/2" x 3 1/2", G/H-1 1/2" x 3 1/2" from figure 2 pile, G/H-1 1/2" x 3 1/2" from figure 2 pile, H-1 1/2" x 3 1/2", H-2 1/2" x 3 1/2", A/H-2 1/2" x 3 1/2" from figure 2 pile, BC piece. Press. Label this piece row #8.



- 30.** Sew these pieces right sides together from left to right. B-2 1/2" x 3 1/2", C-1 1/2" x 3 1/2", C/H-1 1/2" x 3 1/2" from figure 1 pile, I/H-1 1/2" x 3 1/2" from figure 1 pile, I/H-1 1/2" x 3 1/2" from figure 1 pile, I/H-1 1/2" x 3 1/2" from figure 1 pile, F/H-1 1/2" x 3 1/2" from figure 1 pile, F/H-1 1/2" x 3 1/2" from figure 1 pile, H-1 1/2" x 3 1/2", H-2 1/2" x 3 1/2", C-2 1/2" x 3 1/2", H-1 1/2" x 3 1/2", H-2 1/2" x 3 1/2", C-1 1/2" x 3 1/2", C/H-1 1/2" x 3 1/2" from figure 2 pile, H-2 1/2" x 3 1/2", A/H-1 1/2" x 3 1/2" from figure 2 pile, A-1 1/2" x 3 1/2", B-2 1/2" x 3 1/2". Press. Label this piece row #9.



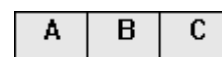
- 31.** Take one of the $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " pieces of fabric H and lay it face up on the table. Now take one of the $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " pieces of fabric C which has a line on it and lay it face down on the H piece matching it to the lower edge and positioning the line as shown. Pin the 2 pieces together, and sew along the pencil mark. Trim the corner approximately $\frac{1}{4}$ " from the seam line, cutting through both layers. Press open. Take another $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " piece of fabric H and lay it face up on the table. Now take one of the $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $1\frac{1}{2}$ " pieces of fabric G which has a line on it and lay it face down on the H piece matching it to the lower right corner and positioning the line as shown. Pin, sew along the line, trim the corner, and press open. These 2 pieces will be used in the next step.



- 32.** Sew these pieces right sides together from left to right. A- $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ ", B/H- $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " from figure 1 pile, I/H- $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " from figure 1 pile, I/H- $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " from figure 1 pile, I/H- $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " from figure 1 pile, F/H- $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " from figure 1 pile, F/H- $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " from figure 1 pile, H- $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ ", H- $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ ", C- $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ ", H- $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ ", piece from previous step, C- $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ ", C/H- $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " from figure 2 pile, piece from previous step, G/C- $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " from figure 2 pile, A- $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ ". Press. Label this piece row #10.



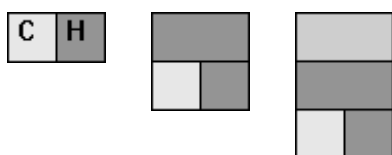
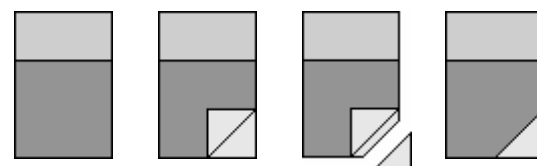
- 33.** Take one each of pieces A, B, and C all $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ ". Sew them right sides together as shown. Repeat so you have 2 of these pieces. Press.



- 34.** Take fabric J and sew the pieces from the previous step to each side of it as shown, right sides together. Press. Label this piece row #11.

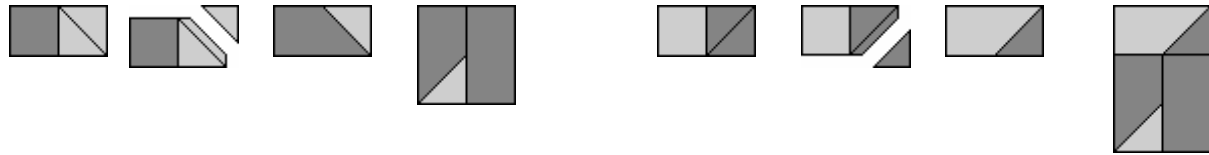


- 35.** Sew a piece of $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " fabric I to a piece of $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " fabric H as shown. Press. Repeat so you have 2 of these pieces. Set one of these pieces aside. Lay the other piece face up on the table. Place one of the $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $1\frac{1}{2}$ " pieces of fabric C which has a line on it face down matching it to the lower right corner and positioning the line as shown. Pin, sew along the line, trim the corner, and press open. Set this piece aside.



Sew a piece of $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $1\frac{1}{2}$ " fabric C to a piece of $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $1\frac{1}{2}$ " fabric H as shown. Press. Sew a piece of $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " fabric H to the top of the piece as shown. Press. Sew a piece of $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " fabric I to the top of the piece as shown. Press. Set this piece aside.

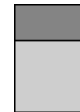
Lay one of the $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " pieces of fabric H face up on the table. Place of the $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $1\frac{1}{2}$ " pieces of fabric I which has a line on it face down matching it to the upper right corner and positioning the line as shown. Pin, sew along the line, trim the corner, and press open. Sew this piece to one of the $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " pieces of fabric H as shown. Press. Lay one of the $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " pieces of fabric I face up on the table. Place of the $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $1\frac{1}{2}$ " pieces of fabric H which has a line on it face down matching it to the lower right corner and positioning the line as shown. Pin, sew along the line, trim the corner, and press open. Sew this to the previous piece as shown. Press. These 4 pieces will be used in the next step.



- 36.** Sew these pieces right sides together from left to right. C- $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ ", A/H- $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " from figure 2 pile, H- $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ ", I/H- $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " from figure 2 pile, I- $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ ", H- $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ ", I- $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ ", I/H- $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " from figure 1 pile, H- $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ ", I/H- $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " from figure 2 pile, I- $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ ", piece from previous step, piece from previous step, piece from previous step, piece from previous step, G/H- $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " from figure 1 pile, G/B- $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " from figure 1 pile, C- $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ ". Press. Label this piece row #12.



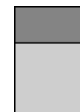
- 37.** Sew a piece of $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " fabric H to a piece of $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " fabric C as shown. Press. This piece will be used in the next step.



- 38.** Sew these pieces right sides together from left to right. B- $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ ", C- $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ ", C/H- $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " from figure 2 pile, H- $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ ", I/H- $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " from figure 2 pile, I/H- $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " from figure 2 pile, I/H- $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " from figure 2 pile, I- $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ ", I/H- $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " from figure 1 pile, H- $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ ", piece from previous step, H- $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ ", C/H- $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " from figure 1 pile, C- $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ ", C/H- $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " from figure 1 pile, I/H- $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " from figure 1 pile, I/H- $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " from figure 1 pile, G/H- $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " from figure 1 pile, G/A- $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " from figure 1 pile, A- $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ ", B- $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ ". - 39.** Sew a piece of $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " fabric H to a piece of $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " fabric C as shown. Press. This piece will be used in the next step.



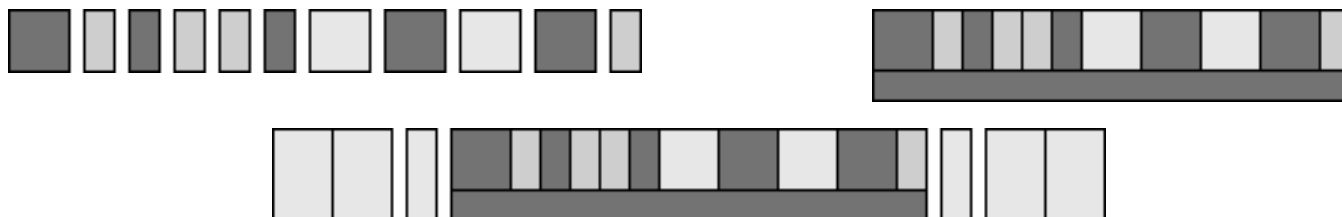
- 40.** Sew these pieces right sides together from left to right. AB piece, C/H- $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " from figure 2 pile, H- $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ ", I/H- $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " from figure 2 pile, I/H- $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " from figure 2 pile, I/H- $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " from figure 2 pile, I/H- $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " from figure 2 pile, H- $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ ", piece from previous step, H- $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ ", H- $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ ", I/H- $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " from figure 1 pile, I/H- $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " from figure 1 pile, G/H- $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " from figure 1 pile, G/B- $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $3\frac{1}{2}$ " from figure 1 pile, CA piece. Press. Label this piece row #14.



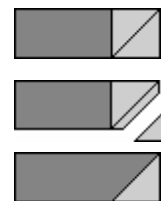
- 41.** Sew these pieces right sides together from left to right. CA piece, B-1 ½" x 3 ½", H-2 ½" x 3 ½", I-1 ½" x 3 ½", H-1 ½" x 3 ½", I-1 ½" x 3 ½", H-2 ½" x 3 ½", C-2 ½" x 3 ½", H-2 ½" x 3 ½", C-2 ½" x 3 ½", H-2 ½" x 3 ½", G-1 ½" x 3 ½", A-1 ½" x 3 ½", BC piece. Press. Label this piece row #15.



- 42.** Sew these pieces right sides together from left to right. H-2 ½" x 2 ½", I-1 ½" x 2 ½", H-1 ½" x 2 ½", I-1 ½" x 2 ½", F-1 ½" x 2 ½", H-1 ½" x 2 ½", C-2 ½" x 2 ½", H-2 ½" x 2 ½", C-2 ½" x 2 ½", H-2 ½" x 2 ½", G-1 ½" x 2 ½". Press. Now sew a piece of fabric H 1 ½" x 16 ½" to the bottom of this piece. Add one BC piece and one A-1 ½" x 3 ½" to the front of the row. Add one C-1 ½" x 3 ½" and one AB piece to the end of the row. Press. Label this piece row #16.



- 43.** Take one of the 1 ½" x 3 ½" piece of fabric H and lay it face up on the table. Now take on of the 1 ½" x 1 ½" pieces of fabric I which has a line on it and lay it face down on the H piece matching it to the lower right corner and positioning the line as shown. Pin, sew along the line, trim the corner, and press open. This piece will be used in the next step.



- 44.** Sew these pieces right sides together from left to right. A-2 ½" x 3 ½", B-1 ½" x 3 ½", B/H-2 ½" x 3 ½" from figure 1 pile, I/H-1 ½" x 3 ½" from figure 1 pile, H-2 ½" x 3 ½", I/H-1 ½" x 3 ½" from figure 1 pile, I/F-1 ½" x 3 ½" from figure 1 pile, F/H-1 ½" x 3 ½" from figure 1 pile, H-1 ½" x 3 ½", C-2 ½" x 3 ½", H-1 ½" x 3 ½", C/H-1 ½" x 3 ½" from figure 2 pile, C-1 ½" x 3 ½", C/H-1 ½" x 3 ½" from figure 2 pile, H-2 ½" x 3 ½", piece from previous step, C/H-2 ½" x 3 ½" from figure 2 pile, C-1 ½" x 3 ½", A-2 ½" x 3 ½". Press. Label this piece row #17.



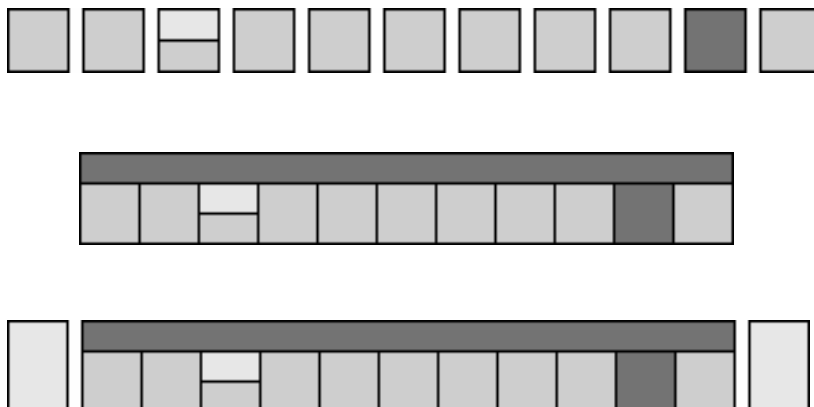
- 45.** Sew these pieces right sides together from left to right. C-2 ½" x 3 ½", A/H-1 ½" x 3 ½" from figure 1 pile, H-1 ½" x 3 ½", I/H-1 ½" x 3 ½" from figure 1 pile, I/H-1 ½" x 3 ½" from figure 1 pile, H-1 ½" x 3 ½", I/H-1 ½" x 3 ½" from figure 1 pile, I/F-1 ½" x 3 ½" from figure 1 pile, F/H-1 ½" x 3 ½" from figure 1 pile, H-2 ½" x 3 ½", C-2 ½" x 3 ½", H-2 ½" x 3 ½", C/H-1 ½" x 3 ½" from figure 2 pile, C-1 ½" x 3 ½", C/H-1 ½" x 3 ½" from figure 2 pile, H-1 ½" x 3 ½", I/H-1 ½" x 3 ½" from figure 2 pile, I/H-1 ½" x 3 ½" from figure 2 pile, G/H-1 ½" x 3 ½" from figure 2 pile, G/B-1 ½" x 3 ½" from figure 2 pile, C-2 ½" x 3 ½". Press. Label this piece row #18.



- 46.** Sew a piece of 1 ½" x 2 ½" fabric F to a piece of 1 ½" x 2 ½" fabric G as shown. Press. This piece will be used in the next step.



- 47.** Sew these pieces right sides together from left to right. G-2 ½" x 2 ½", G-2 ½" x 2 ½", piece from previous step, 6 pieces of G-2 ½" x 2 ½", H-2 ½" x 2 ½", G-2 ½" x 2 ½". Press. Now sew a piece of fabric H 1 ½" x 22 ½" to the top of this piece. Press. Add one piece of B-2 ½" x 3 ½" to the front of the row. Add one piece of B-2 ½" x 3 ½" to the end of the row. Press. Label this piece row #19.

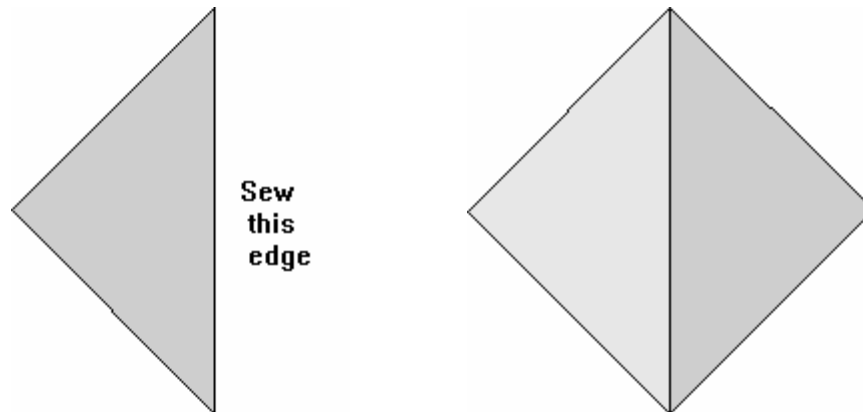


- 48.** Lay out rows 1-20 in order on a large table or the floor, row 1 at the top and row 20 at the bottom. You should see the shape of the cola bottle. Fold row #1 down over the 2,3,4,5,6 piece, right sides together, matching the top edge. Sew along the long top edge, and press seam allowance toward row #1. Fold row #7 over row #8, right sides together, matching edges. Sew along the long top edge, and press seam allowance toward row #7. Fold row #9 over row #10, right sides together, matching edges. Sew along the long top edge, and press seam allowance toward row #9. Fold row #11 over row #12, right sides together, matching edges. Sew along the long top edge, and press seam allowance toward row #11. Fold row #13 over row #14, right sides together, matching edges. Sew along the long top edge, and press seam allowance toward row #13. Fold row #15 over row #16, right sides together, matching edges. Sew along the long top edge, and press seam allowance toward row #15. Fold row #17 over row #18, right sides together, matching edges. Sew along the long top edge, and press seam allowance toward row #17. Fold row #19 over row #20, right sides together, matching edges. Sew along the long top edge, and press seam allowance toward row #19.

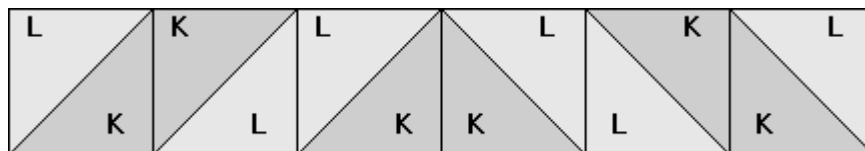
- 49.** Lay out the rows by number again. Fold the 1,2,3,4,5,6 piece over the 7 & 8 piece, right sides together, matching the top edge. Sew along the long top edge. Press seam allowance the same direction as the others. Fold the 9 & 10 piece over the 11 & 12 piece, right sides together, matching edges. Sew along the long top edge. Press seam allowance. Fold the 13 & 14 piece over the 15 & 16 piece, right sides together, matching edges. Sew along the long top edge. Press seam allowance. Fold the 17 & 18 piece over the 19 & 20 piece, right sides together, matching edges. Sew along the long top edge. Press seam allowance.

- 50.** Lay out the rows by number again. Fold the 1,2,3,4,5,6,7,8 piece over the 9,10,11,12 piece, right sides together, matching the top edge. Sew along the long top edge. Press seam allowance the same direction as the others. Fold the 13,14,15,16 piece over the 17,18,19,20 piece, right sides together, matching edges. Sew along the long top edge. Press seam allowance. Lay out the 2 large pieces. Fold the 1,2,3,4,5,6,7,8,9,10,11,12 piece over the 13,14,15,16,17,18,19,20 piece, right sides together, matching the top edge. Sew along the long top edge. Press seam allowance the same direction as the others. Set this large piece aside for now.

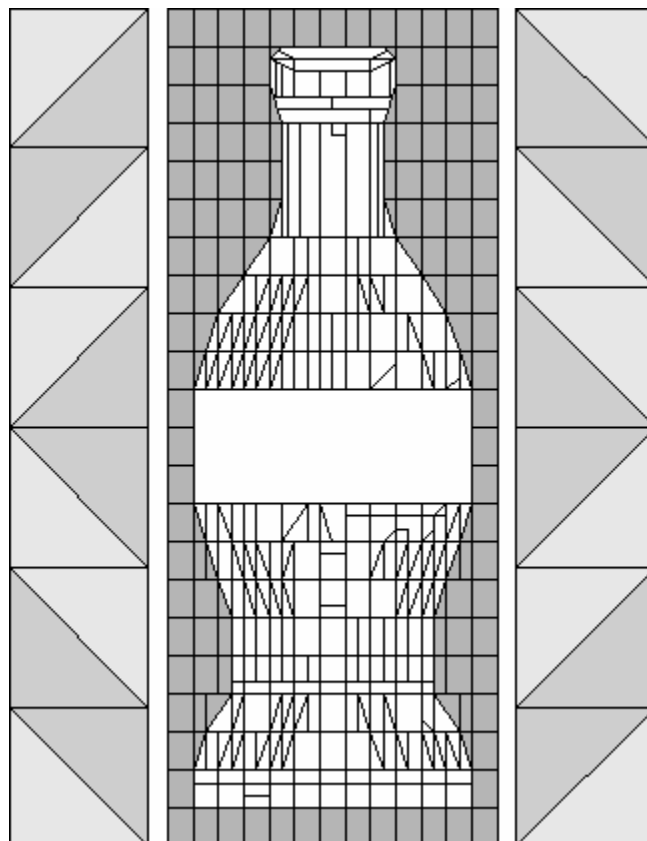
- 51.** Sew one of the fabric K triangles to one of the fabric L triangles, right sides together, and sew along the long edge. Open and press. Repeat 11 more times so you have a total of 12 of these pieces. Trim these squares down to 11.5" x 11.5" if necessary.



- 52.** Sew these pieces, right sides together, as shown. Press. Repeat so you have 2 of these pieces.

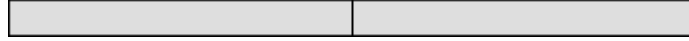


- 53.** Sew the 2 pieces from the previous step to the sides of the large cola bottle piece, right sides together, as shown. Press.



SEWING THE BORDERS

- 54.** Take border fabric O. Sew together 2 long pieces, right sides together, to make one very long piece as shown below. Repeat, so you have a total of 2 of these pieces.

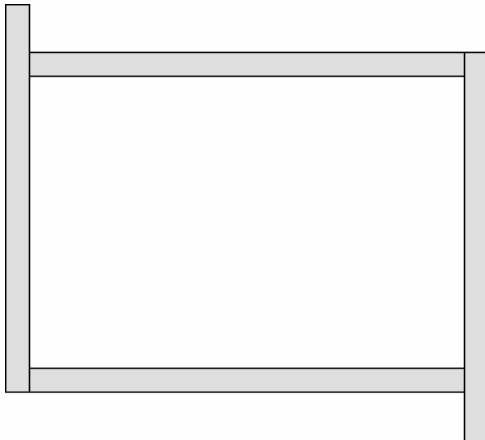


- 55.** Sew these pieces to the side edges of the quilt, right sides together as shown. Press seam allowance toward the border.

- 56.** Trim the excess border fabric to make it straight and even with the edge of the quilt.



- 57.** Sew together 1 long piece and 1 short piece of border fabric O, right sides together, to make one long piece as shown. Press seam to one side. Repeat so you have a total of 2 of these pieces.



- 58.** Sew these pieces to the top and bottom edges of the quilt, right sides together as shown. Press seam allowance toward the border.

- 59.** Trim the excess border fabric to make the edge straight and even. Your finished quilt top will measure approximately 74" x 59".
